

QAR

(Question-Answer Relationship)

QAR is a method for identifying where you will find answers to questions. The purpose of this method is to learn how to use information from the question to determine where best to find the answer.

There are four types of question-answer relationships that fall into two categories.

In the Book

Right There

The words used to make up the question and words used to answer the question are in the same sentence.

Think and Search

Questions and answers come from different parts of the text, and the words for each are not found in the same parts of the text.

In My Head



Author and Me

The answer is not entirely in the story. The answer is determined by what you already know *and* what the author tells in the text.



On My Own

Answers come from my own background information and can be answered without reading the text.
